Cobourg Police Service Bi-Weekly Update

COBOURG (May 12, 2023) – The Cobourg Police Service (CPS) bi-weekly update provides an overview of break and enters, theft from motor vehicles, mischief, and other crime trends in the Town of Cobourg over two weeks. In addition, CPS has added warrant arrests for the report.

In addition to the bi-weekly update, an operational report is provided to the Cobourg Police Services Board (CPSB) every month. The operational report offers a breakdown of calls for service, year to year comparable on crime trends, and highlights calls of interest. CPS operational reports can be found in the CPSB meeting minutes online through <u>eScribe</u>, the Town of Cobourg public meeting website.

Community members can access information about police activity in Cobourg through the crime mapping tool available at <u>cobourgpoliceservice.com</u>.

From April 24 to May 7, 2023, CPS responded to 528 calls for service.

- Break and enter: 0
- Theft from vehicles : Five (5)
 - o Sutherland Crescent and Ontario Street
 - University Street and Walton (2) person arrested
 - James Street and College Street (2)
- Distraction theft: none during this time frame
- Mischief: Two (2) Chapel Street and Division Street (vehicle damaged), Carlisle Street and Curtis Crescent
- Fraud: Seven 7 frauds including counterfeit cash, phone scam, Puppy ad scam, paving scam, and online purchase

Four warrant arrests were made including fail to appear, theft (2), and harassment.

Crime Prevention - Lock It or Lose

Cobourg Police Service's Lock It or Lose It campaign encourages drivers to take precautions to protect their vehicles and its contents from theft. Whether it is parking at work, at the store, or at home, leaving valuables in plain sight or the vehicle unlocked makes an easy target for thieves.

With this initiative, CPS auxiliary members go into the community to educate the public on crime prevention. Auxiliary officers examine parked vehicles to confirm they are locked and no valuables have been left in view. They place a small notice on vehicles that have been checked to indicate what safety precautions were

neglected and to offer simple crime-prevention tips. Drivers who have secured their vehicles will receive notices congratulating them for their actions.

The *Lock It or Lose* It campaign runs all year with a particular emphasis during key seasons or when there is an increase in reports received by police.

Here are some tips to protect your vehicle and its contents:

- Ensure doors are always locked.
- Park in well-lit areas.
- Never leave money, cell phones, valuables, or personal property in plain sight.
- Always roll up your car windows.
- Put shopping bags and other parcels in the trunk.
- Don't leave your car running unattended.
- If parking in the same lot often, park in different spots each day
